CEO'S HIGHLIGHTS

As we bid farewell to 2023 and another impactful year, it is with immense pride and gratitude that we reflect on the accomplishments and milestones achieved by Kingston Centre for Independent Living. The unwavering commitment of our team and the support of our community have played pivotal roles in driving positive change in the disability sector.

As part of our strategy to enable disabled people in southwest London to have choice and control over their lives and to diversify KCIL's income, we have successfully won two new exciting projects with an adjoining borough – the London Borough of Sutton - that helps to bring independence to a greater number of disabled adults and children and bolster our finances during a difficult period.

In April 2023 we launched a new service

– Independent Travel Training – which is a
fantastic programme to teach SEND children
using Assisted Transport to travel independently
on public transport, teaching road and personal
safety skills, this builds confidence, improves
social skills and allows the young people greater
freedom. Our new trainer – Naomi Duhaney –
has been touring schools, delivering workshops,
training young people to use buses, timetables,
journey planning and contingency planning.

In July 2023 we won and mobilised our 2nd Sutton service – PA Brokerage – building on the excellent work we have carried out within Direct Payments with Kingston council, we now help people to recruit a Personal Assistant across three boroughs – Kingston, Sutton and Richmond.

Following a challenging 2022 into 2023 where we saw three KCIL stalwarts retire (Robert Reilly, John Morris and Phil Levick) with a combined service of almost 40 years we have since recruited well and seen all new team members flourish in their new roles. Joanne Stafferton has taken over the Office Manager role and has expanded this to include marketing, promotion and operations. The entire KCIL marketing offer has been revamped by Joanne over the last two years and she has created multiple new KCIL brands that reflect our new diverse range of services.

KCIL's Direct Payment Support and Advice continued to help people to have choice and control over their support and our new recruiter - Aggie - has moved the speed with which we source staff to a new level, finding people with new methods, matching people to a PA much faster than in previous years. Our work with Achieving for Children has progressed well in the last year and we now support in excess of 180 families with SEND children in receipt of an EHCP to set up their personal budget. This work has now been extended into Adult Personal Budgets within continuing healthcare and the NHS. Helen Green, Maria Keskes and our new member Natasha Veeren have been spearheading this work over the last 12 months.

As we look forward to 2024, we know that we have some challenging times ahead of us, not least with our funding streams, pressures on local authority spending and the increased cost of operations. KCIL is fortunate to have a committed and passionate team in place that will strive to support our community with the issues that are important to them. Thank you to all our staff, volunteers, trustees and members for all their contributions over the past year.



DIRECT PAYMENTS

KCIL'S WORK IN 2023

Since January 2023 we have had 48 new referrals to the Direct Payments Support service with 188 adults including new and established users on average using the service.

The main reason for choosing a Direct Payment remains the same – having choice and control over your life

Since Aggie joined us as Recruiter in April we have reduced the time taken to match someone with a PA from 7 weeks to just under 5 weeks

The number of people receiving support from KCIL to set up their PA on the payroll service and to recruit a PA have both risen

In 2023 KCIL arranged training for 74 Personal Assistants and their employers in First Aid, Manual Handling, Safeguarding, Infection control. Since securing funding from Skills for Care every year since 2020 we have arranged training for over 500 sessions

CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

SHORT BREAK DIRECT PAYMENT SUPPORT

In 2023 we have assisted 114 families and children with Direct Payment Support and advice across Kingston & Richmond.

This service involves matching PA's to parents, providing support for parents to be a good employers, supporting with recruitment, paperwork and payroll.

SEND BROKERAGE

In 2023 we have seen the number of families using the SEND Brokerage service increase to 182

We support families that are new to the process right the way through from initial application to sourcing services, staffing and equipment.

Helen and Natasha provide a person-centred approach to support SEND children and their families to arrange their personal budget. Feedback shows this personalised approach benefits the whole family.

KCIL has developed a pathway for EHCP coordinators to follow and now spends time in AFC offices upskilling and reviewing individual packages.

Can you tell me about your role at KCIL?

Independent Travel Trainer for Sutton and KCIL, I developed the programme materials using a variety of resources including road safety guidelines, the needs of the young people within the community, and the desires of the parents and carers. I ensure that young people build confidence and resilience through travel training then eventually travelling independently, this leads to new work and training opportunities, friendships and so much more.

I work closely with schools across Sutton, liaising with SENDCO's, SEND coordinator's, teachers and TA's, ensuring the needs of the child/young person are consistently being met and the communication between the parent/carers, Sutton, the school and I, remains fluent. I have fortnightly meetings with COGNUS where we discuss current young people receiving ITT as well as potential candidates, this includes creating a timetable for the assisted transport team.

Soon there will be a new generation of travellers in Sutton that maybe would have never tried if it wasn't for Independent Travel Training.

What do you most enjoy doing when you are not working?

I enjoy spending time with my family, most importantly my daughter who is fast becoming an adult.




SUTTON INDEPENDENT TRAVEL TRAINING SERVICE

Sutton Independent Travel Training launched in April 2023. Independent travel training (ITT) supports young people in developing an important skill for life. ITT has a positive effect on the lives of young people, as well as those around them. Successful travel training enables young people to open their lives to more opportunities for education, employment and social activities. ITT increases confidence, independence and choice for young people.

The ITT programme is an individualised travel training programme which includes:

one-to-one personalised travel trainer support journey planning road and personal safety skills time management emergency strategies stranger awareness contactless payment methods.



SUTTON PERSONAL ASSISTANT SUPPORT SERVICE

Sutton Personal Assistant Support Service launched in July 2023, building on KCIL's expertise in recruiting PAs in the boroughs of Kingston and Richmond. Working with Sutton Adult Social Care and additional outside referrers, we're working with disabled people to highlight the benefits of having a Personal Assistant (PA). We're reaching out to potential PAs in the Sutton area through career events, coffee mornings and PA training sessions, spreading knowledge about the personally rewarding and flexible role of being a PA across South West London.
