About this booklet



This booklet is from NHS South West London.



It is about using the NHS app.



An **app** is a computer programme for your phone or tablet.



This booklet will tell you what you can use the app for and how to get it on your phone.

About the NHS app



You can use the NHS app to:

• Order more of the medicines that you usually take.



• Book a doctor's appointment.



 Look at your health records to see information about your health and care.



• Book a **vaccine** appointment.

Vaccines are injections or jabs that help to stop you from being ill with a certain illness.

You can also use the NHS app to:



• Tell the NHS whether you are okay with **donating your organs**.

Donating your organs allows doctors to give some of your body parts to others who need them when you die.

You do not have to allow this, it is your choice.



 Make choices about how the NHS uses your information.



 Use some NHS services, like NHS 111 online.

Booking an appointment



If you cannot find where to book a doctor's appointment on the NHS app, check the 'services' page.



There may be a button that says 'contact your GP surgery about a health problem'.

This should tell you how to book a doctor's appointment.



Some GP surgeries may not allow patients to book doctor's appointments using the NHS app.



This means you will still need to contact your GP surgery to book a doctor's appointment.

Help with using the NHS app



We have staff members who can help you with using the NHS app.

We call them **Digital Coordinators**.



If you live in Sutton or Merton, your Digital Coordinator is Tanuja.

You can contact them by calling 020 3922 1554.

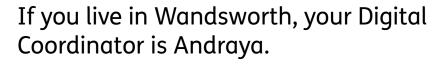


You can only call them between 10:00am and 2:00pm on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday.
